## CT Behavioral Health Spotlight


- DSS has issued a Notice of Proposed Medicaid State Plan Amendment concerning UCC billing.
  This includes supplemental payments in FY26, which will enable UCCs to access state-allocated funding to help sustain this level of care.
- Griffin Hospital in Connecticut has launched a new alternative to the traditional emergency room for individuals experiencing a mental health crisis. The Emergency Psychiatric Assessment, Treatment and Healing (EmPATH) unit is designed to enhance care for community members in psychiatric distress, offering a specially tailored environment that emphasizes compassion, dignity, and a patient-centered approach (tentative TCB presentation).
